Dear AGORA followers,

The Project has reached its second year of activity, achieving significant results in all its [Five Experiments](#) and [Open Access Resources](#) (OA Resources).

Here is the most **relevant news** covering the period **January 2012 – January 2013**:

New Online Journals: the Project published online and in print the first issue of [Nordic Wittgenstein Review](#), with 13 new articles and contributions now available for the Community. The first issue of the International Journal [Lexicon Philosophicum](#) will soon follow.

Project Portals: a large number of **new resources** have been added to the [Daphnet portal](#) (primary sources on Ancient and Modern Philosophy: i.e. Giambattista Vico's complete Works and the main part of Sextus Empiricus' s *opera omnia*), to [Daphnet Digital Library](#) (secondary sources: i.e. Spinelli's *Questioni Scettiche*), to [Nietzsche Source](#) (i.e. the complete edition of N. letters), and to the [Wittgenstein Secondary Sources](#) portals (i.e. a selection of texts, audio and video files). 12 volumes of Jean Jacques Rousseau manuscripts are about to be published in a dedicated platform. Explore the portals to find more scientific OA resources.

Events and meetings: the AGORA consortium is very active in participating in various initiatives (see [Publications and Presentations](#)). We draw your attention to two events: in January 17-18, 2013 the Project was presented and discussed at the two-days workshop "[Open Platforms for Digital Humanities. State of the art and perspectives](#)". The workshop, followed by a focus group section, gave an overview of Digital Library projects in the Humanities that make use of semantic web technologies and designed possible future developments. In July 2013 the Project will be presented at the annual international conference: [Digital Humanities 2013](#) hosted by the Center for Digital Research in the Humanities at the University of Nebraska–Lincoln.
